MESSAGE FROM LEADERSHIP

In 2020:

- TTCU put the safety of its membership and staff first, introducing additional cleaning and other safety measures, including allowing many back-office staff to work from home to minimize their risk and the risk to others.

- We completed a system upgrade which gives us greater capacity to serve our membership.
- We expanded our physical footprint by opening branches in Oklahoma City and Sand Springs to better serve our members in those areas.
- And not least, TTCU helped record numbers of members refinance their homes or purchase new homes, saving them money and helping them make their financial goals a reality.

In 2021, as the vaccine rollout continues, we look forward to putting the pandemic behind us. We're planning for a bright future, both for TTCU and our members. 






Return on Assets




Gross Loan Volumes
